


for O&M Specialists and Dog Guide Mobility Instructors

Orientation and Mobility Specialists in Australia and New Zealand are mostly employed by one of the low vision/blindness agencies or education departments. After graduation, it is a good idea to work for one of the major employers to consolidate skills in O&M client services. You become part of a team, learn from the experts, identify your own areas of interest, and establish your professional networks. These employers help us to understand how the O&M industry works. But O&M is an obscure profession and moving beyond the major employers is one way to share the news about what O&M specialists do. After a few years' experience, you

might choose to stay on, to specialise, or to branch out in a new direction.

The mind-map of O&M Career Pathways on page 2 provides some ideas for O&M specialists. Some of the career pathways build on previous qualifications, some require further study or upskilling and some involve moving to another employer.



Some people work for a low vision/


blindness service provider throughout their whole career, gaining a deep knowledge of the industry, its people and resources that is invaluable to new graduates.

Some specialize, becoming experts in O&M fields such as deafblindness, neurological complications, assistive technology or paediatric work. Some are dual qualified and can serve a double role (e.g., O&M/OT).

Some choose to step out of mainstream employment and set up as an independent service provider or take their O&M expertise into a parallel role where experience in O&M services can bring unique benefits to a broader client base (e.g., disability services). Then there are opportunities in management, teaching and research.
